Memorandum of Understanding Between the Department of Health and Human Service of the United States of America and the Ministry of Public Health of the Republic of Cuba

Signed in 2016 following President Obama’s opening towards Cuba, this far-reaching framework is still in effect. “The objective of this MOU is to establish a strategy for cooperation in the field of health and its development, through the implementation of scientific, academic, technical, and research based projects and exchanges, the exchange of technical information, and other activities of interest to both Participants, to the extent authorized by law.” The MOU makes specific reference to arboviruses.

Memorandum of Understanding in the Area of Cancer Between the Department of Health and Human Service of the United States of America and the Ministry of Public Health of the Republic of Cuba

This second agreement penned in 2006 was intended to “establish the general framework of collaboration in the area of cancer control, including research, surveillance, monitoring and evaluation.” It, too, is still in force.
